

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


#### The Apostolic Greeting


- The grace of our Lord † Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.

#### The Word

First Lesson ...... 2 Kings 2:1–12a

When the Lord was about to take Elijah up to heaven in a whirlwind, Elijah and Elisha were on their way from Gilgal. <sup>2</sup> Elijah said to Elisha, "Stay here; the Lord has sent me to Bethel."

But Elisha said, "As surely as the Lord lives and as you live, I will not leave you." So they went down to Bethel.

<sup>3</sup> The company of the prophets at Bethel came out to Elisha and asked, "Do you know that the Lord is going to take your master from you today?"

"Yes, I know," Elisha replied, "but do not speak of it."

<sup>4</sup>Then Elijah said to him, "Stay here, Elisha; the Lord has sent me to Jericho."

And he replied, "As surely as the Lord lives and as you live, I will not leave you." So they went to Jericho.

<sup>5</sup> The company of the prophets at Jericho went up to Elisha and asked him, "Do you know that the Lord is going to take your master from you today?"

"Yes, I know," he replied, "but do not speak of it."

<sup>6</sup> Then Elijah said to him, "Stay here; the Lord has sent me to the Jordan."

And he replied, "As surely as the Lord lives and as you live, I will not leave you." So the two of them walked on.

<sup>7</sup> Fifty men of the company of the prophets went and stood at a distance, facing the place where Elijah and Elisha had stopped at the Jordan. <sup>8</sup> Elijah took his cloak, rolled it up and struck the water with it. The water divided to the right and to the left, and the two of them crossed over on dry ground.

<sup>9</sup> When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Tell me, what can I do for you before I am taken from you?"


"Let me inherit a double portion of your spirit," Elisha replied.

<sup>10</sup> "You have asked a difficult thing," Elijah said, "yet if you see me when I am taken from you, it will be yours—otherwise not."

<sup>11</sup> As they were walking along and talking together, suddenly a chariot of fire and horses of fire appeared and separated the two of them, and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind. <sup>12</sup> Elisha saw this and cried out, "My father! My father! The chariots and horsemen of Israel!" And Elisha saw him no more.


I will proclaim the decree of the LORD:\* He said to me, "You are my Son; today I have become your <u>Fa</u>ther."

**Gospel** ...... Mark 9:2–9

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> After six days Jesus took Peter, James and John with him and led them up a high mountain, where they were all alone. There he was transfigured before them. <sup>3</sup> His clothes became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them. <sup>4</sup> And there

appeared before them Elijah and Moses, who were talking with Jesus.

<sup>5</sup> Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." <sup>6</sup> (He did not know what to say, they were so frightened.)

<sup>7</sup>Then a cloud appeared and enveloped them, and a voice came from the cloud: "This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!"

<sup>8</sup> Suddenly, when they looked around, they no longer saw anyone with them except Jesus.


<sup>9</sup> As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus gave them orders not to tell anyone what they had seen until the Son of Man had risen from the dead.



P Brothers and sisters, go in peace. Live in harmony with one another. Serve the Lord with gladness.



# **GRACE IS .....** UNFATHOMABLE AND GRASPABLE

Whether we like to admit it or not, there are limits to the human ability to comprehend. For example, scientists and mathematicians hotly debate how many stars are in our own galaxy. Depending on the model they use, the total could be between 100 billion and 400 billion. That's a huge difference! And yet, both estimates are such big numbers that we lack the ability to visualize such a vast array of stars in any sort of comprehensible way.

Of course, there is someone who both knows and understands those numbers. He's the one who created each of those stars to begin with: our gracious Father in heaven. He can count those stars, and he can even detail the number of molecules in each one. That which is beyond human comprehension is still child's play in the mind of the infinite, all-powerful Creator.

Perhaps thoughts like these are what prompted the apostle Paul to comment to the Christians in Corinth that no human being could really comprehend the mind and grace of God (1 Corinthians 2:7-11). God's grace is completely unfathomable to me. God continues to love me despite my sin? God, in his perfection, took on my sinfulness and, instead of declaring me guilty, declared me righteous? God wants to spend eternity with me, the worst of sinners? Such is God's grace, and who can understand it?!

That doesn't mean that God's grace is inaccessible to us. God chose to reveal his grace to make it something we can hold on to with rock-solid certainty. He took his unfathomable grace and wrapped it around his Son, Jesus. That's God's gospel message. We hold on to Christ not by our power to think or reason but by the power of the Spirit, who gives us faith to grasp God's grace. Certainly, Paul is not lying to the Colossian congregation when he says, "In the same way, the gospel is bearing fruit and growing throughout the whole world—just as it has been doing among you since the day you heard it and *truly understood God's grace*" (1:6).

We shouldn't be surprised that we can understand God's grace because, despite his vastness, our God is good at making the infinite into something we can understand—Jesus. We can't truly comprehend the vastness of his gracious love, but by his Spirit, we can understand that he put his love into action for the sole purpose of rescuing us from the eternal consequences of sin. Only God's grace, and his grace alone, can remain beyond the depths of human mental capacity and still be held on to by little children so that they—and we—can know with certainty that we are his now and forever.
