

First Lesson Isaiah 40:27–31

²⁷Why do you say, O Jacob, and complain, O Israel, "My way is hidden from the Lord; my cause is disregarded by my God"?

²⁸Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom.

²⁹He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. ³⁰Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; ³¹but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.

is now, and will be forever. <u>A</u>men. *Refrain*


⁶ Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time. ⁷ Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.

²⁹ As soon as they left the synagogue, they went with James and John to the home of Simon and Andrew. ³⁰ Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told Jesus about her. ³¹ So he went to her, took her hand and helped her up. The fever left her and she began to wait on them.

³² That evening after sunset the people brought to Jesus all the sick and demon-possessed. ³³ The whole town gathered at the door, ³⁴ and Jesus healed many who had various diseases. He also drove out many demons, but he would not let the demons speak because they knew who he was.

³⁵ Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. ³⁶ Simon and his companions went to look for him, ³⁷ and when they found him, they exclaimed: "Everyone is looking for you!"







Divine Call Received

Late on Sunday afternoon, January 14, Pastor Lidtke learned that earlier that day the members of Mt. Sinai Lutheran Church in Montrose, MI, and King of Kings Lutheran Church in Frankenmuth, MI, had extended a call for him to serve them as pastor.

He is meeting with Bethlehem congregation this morning, and will return to Faith to announce his decision on February 11.

Faith's Church Council met this past Monday evening. Considering the congregation's financial standing, the Council agreed that we can no longer afford to pay two pastors to meet Faith's ministry needs.

Pastor Grosnick will continue to preach weekly through the month of February. Beginning Sunday, March 3, Faith's worship service will begin a half hour later at 10:30 AM. This allows Pastor Lidtke to conduct worship at Bethlehem at 9:00 AM and then make the drive to Faith to conduct services.

Thanksgiving Celebration for Pastor Grosnick

Pastor Grosnick's service to Faith congregation these last couple of years has been a blessing. As a way to thank him for his faithful service, the Church Council is planning for a celebration gathering following the worship service on February 25. Please keep the day and time open. More details will be announced soon.

Notes from Church Council Meeting of January 29

- ➤Our investment money that remains with the Church Extension Fund are being redeemed. An estimated \$12,529.58 will be received.
- ➤ Lester Fritz, Bethlehem's organist, is reaching out to a representative of the Johannes Organ Company to see what can be done to diagnose and solve the speaker problems our organ is experiencing. (Currently the external speakers are not working.)
- ➤ Pastor Lidtke hopes to reintroduce the order of Common Service in our worship services soon. Perhaps we can also learn the order of Morning Praise. This will provide more variety in our services.
